

## Dr Paris Goodsell Marine Ecology Research Grant Rules

The Dr Paris Goodsell Marine Ecology Research Grant was setup in recognition of Dr Goodsell's contribution to ecological research of marine ecology and in order to support and encourage students providing original and rigorous ecological research of value to Australia.

1. Eligibility for a Dr Paris Goodsell Marine Ecology Research Grant is confined to students currently enrolled at the University of Adelaide in BSc (Honours) or PhD programs within the School of Earth and Environmental Sciences and whose area of research is marine ecology. Students are ineligible if they have previously held a Dr Paris Goodsell Marine Ecology Research Grant.
2. The grant will be given annually on November 17 of each year towards either the costs associated with research or for travel, particularly conference travel. The minimum value given each year will be \$1500 and funds, in the first instance, have been pledged for five years beginning 2011.
3. The successful recipient must provide to the selection committee a written report of the research activities or travel achieved with the grant funds within 3 months of the completion of the project or travel.
4. Applications are to be called for in the month of September for use after November 17. Each Grant will be valid for a period of 12 months. Applications for funds up to the value of AUD\$1,500 will be considered, however the awarded value as well as the number of grants given in each round is at the discretion of the selection committee. Retrospective applications will not be considered. All applications should be submitted to the selection committee on the prescribed form.
5. Grants are made on the condition that they are used solely for the purpose stated in the application.
6. Postgraduate students intending to go abroad for research purposes will need to make separate application for study leave to the Adelaide Graduate Centre, Level 6, 115 Grenfell Street Adelaide SA 5000, Tel 8303 5882. Travel arrangements must be booked through the University Travel System.
7. Selection will be based on academic merit, necessity of the travel or funds to the applicant's research and any other factors deemed important by the Selection Committee. The Selection Committee is coordinated by the Research Education Committee from the School of Earth and Environmental Sciences and will consist of members of staff with relevant knowledge and, where possible, those who knew Dr Goodsell. The Selection Committee will recommend the successful applicant to the Head of School for approval.
8. These rules may be varied from time to time by the University of Adelaide, but the title and general purpose of the grant shall not be changed. The University reserves the right to not award the grant in any year should there be a lack of suitable candidates.
