Professor Riedel will describe the latest situation of the reform treaty, emphasising human rights and terrorism issues, including the relationship of the European Courts of Luxembourg and the Security Council Sanctions Committee, particularly the European Court of Human Rights position on these matters.

Professor Eibe Riedel

Professor Riedel is Professor of Law at the University of Mannheim, Germany, and a member of the UN Committee on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights, presently delegated to the Open-ended Working Group of the UN Human Rights Council to draft an Optional Protocol to the UN Covenant on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights. Since 2001 he has been Adjunct Professor of Law at the University of Adelaide Law School.
