Round 8 of the Premier's Science & Research Fund is now open for Stage 1 "Expression of Interest" applications. Guidelines and application forms are available from:

Stage 1 applications, together with the standard University application coversheet, are due in Research Branch by **Monday 23 August 2010**.

Please note that there are three categories of application, being:

- Standard Research Projects (PSRF support up to 30% total project cost)
- Capability Building Projects (PSRF support up to 50% total project cost)
- ARC Laureate Fellow Support (capped at \$120k p.a. for 3 years and contingent upon ARC success)

##### [eResearch SA: eResearch Survey](#)

eResearch can be broadly defined as the application of advanced information and communications technologies (ICT) to the practice of research. eResearch is a growth area that will soon underpin the efforts of every researcher who analyses data or collaborates with distant colleagues. Substantial increases in research infrastructure funding were announced in the 2009 Federal budget. \$312M was allocated to eResearch related activities as part of the Government's Super Science investment program.

How will this major investment best serve your research needs? Have your say by participating in the 'eResearch Practices in South Australia' online survey. They are interested in your research practices and opinions, whatever your discipline, and whatever the extent of ICT use in your research.

This information will also be used to identify research fields that will benefit from eResearch support, and to establish priorities that will direct future development of eResearch infrastructure and capacity building in South Australia. Your responses will help to increase research community understanding about the role and potential of eResearch in the Australian context.

Even if you are not currently using digital technologies in your research, you are encouraged to complete the survey. Your answers will help eResearch SA to find out about the potential of ICT in your research area and the services and tools that you will need to meet your future needs.
